

R-3 – Excursion – Seven Little Wonders On Thursday we attended a performance by The Paper Boats company at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre called 'Seven Little Wonders'. All children enjoyed viewing this theatre play on stage.

6 of our children performed with the characters Imagen and StarMan Sam on stage and did an amazing job. Well done to – Aría, Kaden, Kane, Evie, Jaidyn and Kaylee for their performance on stage.

The story line explored the wonders of light, colour, music and the number seven.

This framework was inspired by Sir Issac Newton's discovery in the  $17^{th}$  Century that white light could be split into the colours of the rainbow using a prism.

Since seven was a magical and mystical number in those times, Newton imagined that he saw seven colours in the rainbow (ROY G BIV ~ red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet) which beautifully coincided with the observation that there are seven notes in the musical scale.


Thus, he imagined that light, colour, music, and sound were intrinsically intertwined as a wonder of the universe.





# The Compton Chronicles

# It all began in 1863 'Compton Downs School'

In 1862 Mr. C.N. Nobes of Mount Gambier sent a letter to the Central Board of Education, saying that the farmers of Compton wanted to have a school. Following this, Compton Downs School was opened in 1863. The Head Mistress was Mrs Brooks and the school was attended by 19 boys and 11 girls.

The first school at Compton was actually a small bark hut. Two years later the first stone building was built using limestone for the walls and shingles for the roof.

No record of the average attendance is available but it is believed that in 1863 the average was ten children.

In 2022, Compton Primary School has a current enrolment of 85 students. There are 4 classrooms and the first school building is now used as the library, teaching resource area, staff room, ICT office and preparation offices.
