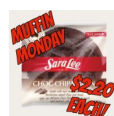

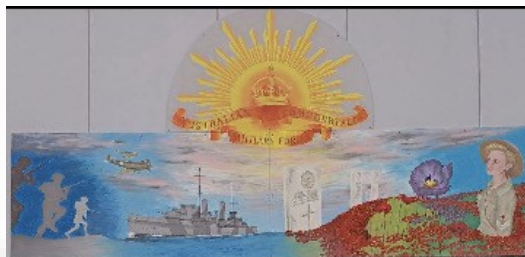


R-3 - Excursion - Peter Combe
