Around the Classrooms Year 5/6

In Maths the Year 5's have been learning a range of multiplication and division strategies, while Year 6's have been investigating properties the of príme, composite, square and triangular numbers. In Writing, we have continued learning about using language features to engage the

audience. On Monday we practised our descriptive writing by taste testing a range of snacks and writing paragraphs to describe the taste. This was a super fun way of practising our descriptive writing skills!




Our class has been busy learning the structure of narratives. Children are working on their goals from their pre-assessment piece of writing feedback.

Year 2/3

Speaking and Listening

We have been working over the month on our skills to share our ideas and thoughts in class discussions and to practice active listening skills (thinking about what someone is saying while they are talking, not thinking about what you are going to say.)

The areas of the curriculum that have been our focus for the first month of schooling and will continue to be a focus for the semester, include -

Reception- They use appropriate interaction skills to listen and respond to others in a familiar environment.

In informal groups and whole class settings, students communicate clearly.

Year 1- Listen to others when taking part in conversations, using appropriate language features and interaction skills.

They interact in pairs, groups and class discussions, taking turns when responding. They make short presentations on familiar topics.

We have been finding our own partners to talk to in class discussions to then share back to the class, have participated in group work activities and we have shared with the class during Talk Time a sentence each day about ourselves, our likes/dislikes and thoughts. Along with this we are given multiple opportunities during the day to share our thoughts and feelings with the class and in modelled and shared reading times. In this time, students choose if they would like to share or if they do not have a connection or prediction, they may choose not to share.

Along with this, we have been practising appropriate ways to get people's attention when we want to speak to them. We say excuse me and wait for eye contact before talking. If we are concerned that the person we want to talk to might forget we have something important to say we hold their hand so they know that what needs to be shared is important to us. Through this process children are learning that while they are incredibly important, it is also important that if an adult or a friend is helping someone with their learning that they wait until that conversation has ended before talking about their own topic of choice.
