#### **Pastoral Care News**

Creating a positive conversation with your child



When talking with your child, show you are interested and care about your child's ideas and opinions. Making eye contact is important. Let them talk without interruption. If you ask your child a question, leave

enough time for your child to process what you are saying and come up with the right words to answer.

Communicating is both verbal and non verbal.

Listening actively - helps your child to feel heard and understood.

Reflective listening- listen to what is being said, think about the meaning of the message, reflect back to the child what they said, confirm that you properly understood their message.

Speak clearly - Try to be at the child's eye level. The way you talk to your child is important for helping them learn language.

Explain feelings - 'I felt.....when....'

I notice - Choose statements like "I notice that you made two circles with the play dough. Can you tell me how you did that?", instead of "Wow, you made such perfect blue ...

Have fun - enjoy being with your children developing relationships with them by having fun.

Our Year 6s are looking forward to our Adelaide Camp next week!






Year 4/5



This week in Maths we have moved onto Fractions. Year 4s are counting by halves and thirds, including those with mixed numbers and locating and representing Fractions on a number line. Year 5s are solving problems involving addition and subtraction of fractions with the same denominator.

In Writing, we have moved on from Narratives to sentence writing. We are working towards making our sentences more descriptive and longer using conjunctions such as FANBOYS.

In Maths children explained their strategies and developed their recall of multiplication facts. We have started working on the connection of multiplication and division through problem solving activities and games.

Year 3s have completed NAPLAN testing last week.

'The Champ' by Anh Do is being read in Modelled Reading as children asked questions before they listened to book and will continue to do so during and after the book is finished. Children are listening for strategies used throughout the book to use in their own reading.
